


Silver Lining Mentoring empowers youth in foster care to flourish through committed mentoring relationships and the development of essential life skills.

### THE ISSUE

### There are **more than 1500 youth** in the Greater Boston area who have been removed from their families and placed in foster care due to abuse and neglect.

- Youth in foster care are frequently moved to different homes and schools —often multiple times in one year.
- Youth in care lack consistent relationships and a sense of belonging cornerstones for healthy development.
- According to the Jim Casey Foundation, the US invests billions of dollars supporting youth impacted by foster care.

## THE SILVER LINING SOLUTION

# Founded in 2001, Silver Lining Mentoring is the only mentoring organization in the Commonwealth exclusively focused on the unique needs of youth in foster care.

- Silver Lining's volunteer mentors are often the only adult in our kids' lives who are not paid to spend time with them.
- Silver Lining's clinically trained social workers support both the mentor and the mentee throughout the relationship.
- "Learn & Earn" is a matched savings, life-skills program offered to youth ages 16 and older in order to develop essential skills including financial literacy, housing and employment.
- Even though youth "age out" of the foster care system at age 18, youth never "age out" of Silver Lining Mentoring's services.
